Utah Code 53G-8-210

Dear Parent:

The Board of Education of the Washington County School District (WCSD) protects the rights of all students and recognizes that every student in the schools should have the opportunity to learn in an environment which is safe, conducive to the learning process, and free from unnecessary disruption. This letter is to notify you and to obtain your involvement in helping to intervene with the habitually disruptive and/or unsafe behavior of your student. To learn more about disruptive/unsafe behavior, please refer to the enclosed Safe School Policy #2110.

Habitually Disruptive Notices are issued when:

A student is at least nine years old, and

A Notice of Disruptive Student Behavior has already been issued, and

The student has now:

Engaged in disruptive behavior at least **six times** during the school year which **did not** result in suspension; Temporary Disciplinary Transfer (TDT) i.e.: removal to an alternative setting; or expulsion; **OR**

Engaged in disruptive behavior at least **three times** during the school year which **did not** result in suspension; Temporary Disciplinary Transfer (TDT) i.e.: removal to an alternative setting; or expulsion; but who also engaged in disruptive behavior least **one time** during the school year **which did** result in suspension; Temporary Disciplinary Transfer (TDT) i.e.: removal to an alternative setting; or expulsion; **OR**

Engaged in disruptive behavior at least **twice** during the school year **which did** result in suspension; Temporary Disciplinary Transfer (TDT) i.e.: removal to an alternative setting; or expulsion.

Included with this notice *OR* within five days of the issuance of this notice we will provide you with documentation of the efforts made by the school counselor, and/or school representatives in an attempt to resolve your student's disruptive behavior.

At this time we are implementing the following intervention:

Please note that as a parent/guardian, you may contest a Notice of Habitually Disruptive Student Behavior within a reasonable time by requesting a meeting with a different school administrator (other than the one who issued the notice); if one is not available, you may contact a representative at the District Office at (435) 673-3553.
